Currently, two scenarios are arising. The first, schools seek to return to "normal" and resume the familiar rhythms of teaching and learning much as they were before the COVID disruption. In the second, schools gear up their programs to remediate learning loss with extended Learning sessions, longer hours, tutoring and learning pods.

Unfortunately, both scenarios are problematic. Pre-pandemic schools Parents do not appreciate Increased Learning time, as that is found to have little positive effect on learning. Hence a third path is proposed entitled Healing, Community, and Humanity on how Students and Teachers Want to Reinvent Schools Post-COVID. Maybe source reinvention while emphasizing community health and welfare over the stresses of remediation may work.

Its also a thought that School may listen to the voices of students and teachers – especially during unprecedented times – not only because they're mostly always right, but because they're always there.

To think about the learning loss which made to think what students might need for next year, but there's a much bigger question, what strengths kids have gained this year and how we might build on that in a constructive way for next year.

Students ranged from being more focused and less distracted at home, to feeling completely disengaged and hating remote learning. Many expressed concern about the loss of irrecoverable chapters of their childhood and adolescence, while also lamenting the loss of social connections to their peers, and missed field trips, sports and extracurricular activities. A few even worried about the erosion of their interpersonal skills. Teachers attuned to the students' needs, stressed the importance of relationship and community building in the years ahead.


The conclusion is we need to work on the Priorities to Help Students Transition Back to School



A special assembly conducted by Grade IV students success is the sum of several small efforts repeated often day in day out .




